From the Principal

There is a scripture reading from 1 Timothy 6:17-19

Tell the rich in the present age not to be proud and not to rely on so uncertain a thing as wealth but rather on God, who richly provides us with all things for our enjoyment. Tell them to do good, to be rich in good works, to be generous, ready to share, thus accumulating as treasure a good foundation for the future, so as to win the life that is true life.

When I read that scripture, it reminded me of the wonderful school community of which I am blessed to be a part. Recently, as you all know, one of our members suffered the tragedy of losing their home (just before Christmas). No sooner was the word out than you, members of this very special community, responded with incredible generosity and thoughtfulness. You defined the real meaning of Christmas.

Christ is "the Light that came into the world" to dispel the darkness of sin and to radiate the truth and love of God (cf. John 3:19-21).

Jesus came into this world to spread the concept of love of God and love of man. You, as the SSA family, have embodied that love by your response to others in need. This is certainly not the first time that I have experienced this from you. I have personally experienced this outpouring of love personally in my own family's time of need. You were so gracious and generous then. I have also seen your teaching of your daughters to respond to others' needs according to Christ's teachings. They give of themselves in service hours (many above and beyond the 20 that are required yearly), they give of themselves with their yearly "Outreach Day" experience (many continuing that service even though that day has ended), they give of themselves by participating in the various collections for people in need (like "Adopt-a-family, coats and warm clothes collection, teddy bears, food for the food bank, etc.) I do not think there has been a time in my 20+ years at SSA that I have ever been disappointed in your response to a call to help someone or an organization in need. I am humbled and very grateful to be able to learn from the love that you all have exhibited and are teaching your girls. And so there are two prayers that I offer to you. The first is a prayer for you in beginning the new year (It can be found on the bishops' site). The second you will recognize as the prayer of St. Francis; it is a reminder that we are called by Jesus to keep the meaning of Christmas alive in our hearts throughout the year.

Remember us, O God; from age to age be our comforter.
You have given us the wonder of time,
blessings in days and nights, seasons and years.
Bless your children at the turning of the year and fill the
months ahead with the bright hope
that is ours in the coming of Christ.
You are our God, living and reigning, forever and ever.
